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Dear Parent/Carer,

There have been a few issues over the last week or so which is why I am writing this letter to clarify things.

Water Bottles

Children can bring a water bottle in to school if they wish. It needs to be taken home every evening to be washed and should contain ONLY WATER.

Uniform

We have done a spot check this morning and several children were not wearing uniform.

Our prospectus contains the uniform guidance which states only school trousers can be worn - no jeans, no jogging trousers (apart from nursery children) and no jeggings. Leggings can only be worn under a dress/skirt and not in place of trousers.

Footwear must be safe and sensible.

Safety

We have been made aware of some very unpleasant and dangerous situations occurring just outside school both on a morning and after school. In order to keep your children safe it is important that we all behave in a way that we want our children to copy.

Smoking and swearing outside the school gates is totally unacceptable as it sets a bad example to all our children.

When crossing the road please do so with Mr Karolia and follow his instruction - walk in front of him not behind.

Do not park on ANY of the yellow lines - even just to drop off.

Do not stop in the middle of the road and allow your children to jump out.

Find a safe place to park, stop the car and make sure your child is safe entering school.

You may have noticed Miss Eddings outside - I will be joining her over the next few weeks and we will be recording any incidents that we see. Some schools publish the registration plates of vehicles that have been involved in dangerous situations - this is something we are considering so please make sure you are not one of these people! And I am sure you do not want a phone call from me asking you to explain the use of foul language - that would be very uncomfortable for both of us!

Voluntary contributions for school trips

I fully understand how tight money can be for families, especially at this time of year and I am also aware that we have had a key stage two trip very close to the pantomime - we will not do this again and I am sorry if it has caused difficulties.
